1493	Columbus brought livestock to West Indies
1519	Cortez brought cattle and sheep to Mexico
1539	DeSoto brought horses and hogs to Florida
1641	William Pynchon, Massachusetts was first meat packer exporting salt pork
1760	Robert Bakewell, England, began breeding animals for a purpose, created different types.
1861-1865	During the Civil War, railroads decreased the need for horses and mules, and for stock to be raised where they are consumed
1861-1865	During the Civil War, change in tastes – beef became most popular.
1861-1865	During the Civil War, refrigeration in box cars allowed shipping of carcasses to population centers
1862	Land Grant Act provides public lands for universities to each agriculture
1872	Hatch Act establishes experiment stations
1914	Smith Lever Act establishes cooperative extension service
